David Todd and Vickie Knight BattyTodd are proud to call Heber Valley home, both having been born and raised in this beautiful area with deep family roots. Their ancestors were among the early settlers of the valley. Dave's great- grandfather, Thomas Todd, traveled to Utah with the Martin Handcart Company and built a cabin in Old Fort Heber. Dave's grandfather, William Russell Wherritt, was one of Heber Valley's first doctors. Vickie's grandparents were also pioneers of community service-they owned and operated one of the first mortuaries in the valley, the Olpin Mortuary. Joseph and Violet Olpin also started and operated the first ambulance service for Wasatch County.

Both David and Vickie attended the old North School Elementary. Although Dave was five years older, the two knew each other and their families were well-acquainted. Their early school days were filled with cherished friendships and memories. Dave grew up with one older sister, Judy. Both siblings graduated from Wasatch High School. David excelled academically and athletically-he played football, basketball, and ran track. In 1965, he went on to play football at Dixie College, $later\ running track\ at Weber\ College.\ He\ earned\ his\ bachelor's\ degree\ in\ Physical\ Education\ from\ Utah\ State\ University.\ In\ Notice that the property of the$ 1969, Dave was drafted into the U.S. Army and served in Vietnam, receiving an honorable discharge in 1971. Upon returning, he was accepted into the University of Utah's Physical Therapy program and graduated as a licensed PT in 1973. Vickie grew up with three brothers, a younger sister, and a neighborhood fullof boys. To survive the rough-and-tumble fun, she proudly became a tomboy. Fighting and playing with the boys, she declared, was far better than playing with dolls!

At Wasatch High School, Vickie was a strong academic student. In the late 1960s, athletic opportunities for girls were limited. The only school-sanctioned activities for girls were the drillteam, cheer team, and cheerleading. Vickie chose cheerleading and enjoyed her time on the squad during her junior year. She graduated with the class of 1970.

Next came Dixie College, where Vickie earned a scholarship. There, her inner tomboy returned-Dixie offered sports for women, and Vickie eagerly participated in as many as she could. Her enthusiasm and talent were recognized when she was awarded Dixie's "All-Around Athlete of the Year" in 1972, along with her diploma. Vickie married her high school sweetheart, LaMar Batty, and they were thrilled to welcome their daughter, Mistie. Vickie worked various jobs to support

LaMar as he pursued a master's degree in Psychology. Tragically, LaMar passed away from cancer just two months before graduation. Vickie made sure he received his degree posthumously from BYU. With the help of family and friends, Vickie returned to school, earning a scholarship to BYU and graduating in 1981 with a degree in Elementary Education.

Fate brought Dave and Vickie back together while out jogging in 1982. They married that same year and welcomed two sons, Dean and Bart, completing their family of five. Today, Dave and Vickie enjoy being active members of the Senior Citizens Center. Though they once joked they'd never be old enough to attend, they now treasure the friendships and wonderful experiences they've gained there.

They want to thank everyone who works so hard to make the Senior Center such a special place. It's a community of kindness, joy, and lifelong memories.



The Tdap vaccine protects against Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (whooping cough). Pertussis can be especially serious for older adults, so staying up to date is essential for your health and safety.




