On September 20, 1948 Ed and Ellene Andrews welcomed their sixth child into the world. They named her Shirley Vee and her two sisters and three brothers along with two half-brothers began spoiling her rotten! I was born in the Powell Wyoming hospital which shortly became the "Old Folks Home" and I delighted in telling people that my parents were so old that I was born in an old folks home! My father was 58 and my mother 33. My half brothers were close in age to my mother. We lived on a farm about 6 miles west of Deaver, Wyoming (population 102). Our home was equipped with electricity but we did not have indoor plumbing. Our neighbors two miles away had a water pump in their house and gas lights. Because my birthday was after Sept. 15th and school did not start until after labor day, I was nearly seven when I started school. We went to school in Deaver where the graduating classes averaged 6-8 students. We were the first to be picked up by the school bus at 7:00 and the last to be dropped off about 4.

We moved from the farm to the "big town" of Lovell (pop. 2000) when I was ten years old. I really did not like the big town and it took me a while to adjust. My mother did not drive and I am sure that my father was preparing her for the time when he would not be there to drive her around. He died when I was 13. I graduated from High School in 1967. Just a couple months after my mom married my step-dad, Dalphon Anderson. The first summer after High School I worked in Atherton, Missouri while staying with a cousin. I taught myself to sew when I was 12 and by the time I was 14 I was making all my clothes, my mother's and my grandmother's.

I attended Ricks College for three semesters, working in Puyallup, Washington the summer after my first year at Ricks. In February 1969 I married Wendell Bray, who left for his second term in Vietnam ten days after we got married. I lived in Casper, Wyo. with his mother Hazel while he was in Vietnam. Hazel and I were best friends until she died. We lived in Casper after he returned home and had three sons, Lee, Troy, and Matt. We were married for eight years. While I was a single mom, I and a friend opened a Pre-School for one year, then her husband was transferred so I sold the pre-school supplies to another woman and went to work for a Periodontist as office manager. I worked for him six years until I married Harry Zane and moved to Billings where we lived for 6 years and had two daughters, Amber and Erin. We moved to Heber City in 1989 where I felt we had come home the first time I drove into the valley! After the girls started school I did some substitute teaching and then went to work for the County where I worked for ten years.

I have enjoyed retirement and my sewing machine for the last fifteen years. I am still sewing, mostly quilts, several days each week hoping to have one for each grandchild by the time I die. We have fifteen grandchildren and a batch of great-grandchildren. Our kids are scattered around the country: Lee in Washington D.C.; Amber in Illinois; Troy in Wyoming; Matt in Eagle Mountain



and Erin in Heber. So, it gives us the opportunity to make some road trips to visit them. We enjoy getting together with all of our friends while participating in the activities at the Senior Citizen's Center!


Stay hydrated with water.
